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Section 1 Before Start

1.1 General Introductions

To avoid or reduce the risk of electric shock, fire, fault, physical injury, loss of life, and damage to device or property, always observe the following cautions.

1.2 Battery



DANGER


2.4 First-Time Operation

To start to operate the tablet, you can follow below steps:

- 1. Read Quick Start Guide firstly.
- 2. Install SD card or SIM card if necessary.
- 3. Charge the tablet.
- 4. Start the tablet.

2.4.1 Installing SIM Card/Micro SD Card

- 1. Unplug SIM/SD slot protective cover.
- 2. Hold the edge of the SIM/SD card holder to pull out the card holder.
- 3. Put the SIM card or SD card on the right position of the card holder.
- 4. Insert card holder all the way in.
- 5. Plug the SIM/SD slot protective cover.



2.4.2 Connecting to AC Adapter


CAUTION: Please only use the AC adapter that comes with your Tablet Computer. Using any other AC adapters may result in damage to both the Tablet Computer and the Battery.

NOTE:

The device is powered by both external AC adapter and internal battery. It is advised to use AC power when you power on the Tablet Computer for the first time.

- 1. Open the I/O protect cover on the left by pulling out the latch.
- 2.Plug the USB cable into the USB type-C connector of the tablet.
- 3. Plug the USB cable to the AC adapter.
- 4. Plug the adapter to the electrical outlet.





The electrical outlet is supplying power to the AC adapter, which in turn powers your Tablet PC. Now, you are ready to turn on the Tablet PC.

2.4.3 Start the tablet

Turn on

Press the power button for 1 second until the logo is displayed.

Turn off

Press and hold the power button until a menu pops up, tap Power off.

Wake up the tablet

If the tablet remains inactivity for a period, the screen will dim and eventually darken to conserve battery power.

To wake up the tablet:


- 1. Press the Power button located on the top side of the tablet.
- 2. Swipe up the screen to unlock.




2.5 Resetting to Factory Defaults

To reset the device to factory defaults:

- 1. Swipe upward to unlock, and then open **Settings** app.
- 2. Tap **System**, user can select to back up application data, WLAN passwords and other settings to Google servers by tapping **Backup**.




3. Tap Reset options.




4. Tap **Erase all data (factory reset)** to reset the tablet.






5. Read all the available information and then press Erase all data to delete all the data in storage such as music or photo.

Section 3 Basic Operations

This section is a common manual about the setting of the SA100 tablet, including the screen, status icons and audio and the power management, which provide instructions to operate the feature of the tablet.

3.1 Using the Touchscreen

3.1.1 Controlling the Touchscreen

The touchscreen is compatible with the primary gesture for Android.

Gesture	Action	Description

Note:

• Ensure that the touchscreen does not come in contact with other electrical devices, as electrostatic discharges may lead to touchscreen malfunctions.



- Avoid tapping the touchscreen with sharp objects or applying excessive pressure with your fingertips to prevent damage.
- It is advisable to refrain from using static graphics on the touchscreen for prolonged periods, as this may cause afterimages (screen burn-in) or ghosting.

3.1.2 the Introduction of Home screen


Home screen and App screen

The Home screen serves as the initial access point for all device functions. It displays widgets, app shortcuts, and additional features.

The Apps screen exhibits icons for all apps, including recently installed ones.

On the Home screen, swipe upwards to open the Apps screen.

To return to the Home screen, swipe upwards or downwards on the Apps screen. Alternatively, press the Home key, the back key or return button.




3.1.3 Personalizing Home Screen


Users have the ability to place application icons, shortcuts, widgets, and other elements on any free space of any Home screen. Additionally, users can modify the wallpaper as desired.

To change wallpaper on the HOME SCREEN:

1. Swipe up from the bottom of the home screen, tap **Settings**, and then tap **Wallpaper**.




2. In the Wallpaper menu select the location of wallpaper, and then tap the type of item you want to add.






To move an item on the Home Screen:

1. Tap and hold the item you want to move, until it can be moved. Drag it to a new location on the screen.



2. Place the item to the target position and release your finger.



To remove items from the Home Screen:

- 1. Tap and hold the item you want to remove. The launcher icon will show Remove on the top of the screen.
- 2. Drag the item you want to remove to the Remove icon.





3. When the icon turns colored, release your finger.



3.2 Changing Touchscreen Modes


- 1. Launch Setting \rightarrow Accessibility \rightarrow Glove mode.

3.3 Using the On-Screen Keyboard

Users have the capability to input text through the On-Screen Keyboard. Certain applications will automatically activate the keyboard, while in others, users must tap on a designated text field to prompt its appearance. This allows users to conveniently enter text using the On-Screen Keyboard.




To enter the text:

- 1. Launch a text field, in this example, we will use the Messaging app to compose a message. This action will trigger the opening of the On-Screen Keyboard.
- 2. Tap on the delete key to remove characters located to the left of the cursor.
- 3. Tap $^{?123}$ to input numbers. Tap ABC again to switch back to letters.






4. To view additional symbols, $tap^{=} \setminus <$ on the numeric keyboard.



5. To enter symbols and other characters, press and hold one of the keys on the top row, then slide your finger upwards to access a list of available options. Release your finger when you have found your desired selection.





6. To close the On-Screen Keyboard, press either the back key on the screen or the back button on the top of the tablet.



3.4 Display Settings

Display setting provide the access to configure the brightness and other screen setting.

1. Swipe up from the bottom of the home screen, launch **Setting**, and then tap **Display**.

Font size	To make the text on screens smaller or larger.
Display size	To make the items on your screen smaller or larger. Some apps on your screen may change position.
Auto-rotate screen	For switching the orientation of the screen when user turns the device sideways or upright.
Screen saver	To control what happens when the tablet is docked and/or sleeping, turn screen saver on.




3.5 Sound Settings



3.5.1 Sound Setting

2. In the **Sound** user can select Media volume, Call volume, Ring volume, Alarm volume and other sound settings.






3.5.2 Adjusting Volume

Press the volume keys to change the media volume (On Home screen) or earpiece volume (during a call). Press the volume key again to set up Vibration mode.







3.6 Language and Keyboard Setting

1. Slide up from the bottom of home screen, select **Setting**, and then tap **System**.







3.7 Managing the Power

Battery setting provides the access to manage the battery, including the battery usage display, battery saver and battery charging.



Set the Battery Saver

Tap Setting \rightarrow Battery \rightarrow Battery Saver.

- Use Battery Saver Battery Saver is always open.
- **Set a schedule** Battery Saver is open when battery percentage reaches the target.

Optimize battery charging

Tap Setting \rightarrow Battery \rightarrow Optimized battery charging.

Enable the function will restrict the maximum charge of the battery to 80% of its total capacity in particular situations. In such situations, the battery will be regarded as fully charged when it reaches 80% capacity.

SIM status	To display the available of the SIM card.

Section 4 Connecting Networks and Wireless Devices


This section provide the instruction to connect SA100 to network and peripheral devices.

4.1 Mobile Networks Connection

SA100 support SIM hots swapping. When users insert a SIM card from a service provider into SA100, the device will be set up to utilize the provider's networks for voice calls and data transmission. It is important to note that various locations may offer different mobile networks, requiring the user to manually configure SA100 to connect to specific networks.

4.1.1 Checking Mobile Network (4G/LTE) Connection

- 1. Swipe up from the bottom of the home screen, tap **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Network & Internet.




3. Tap Mobile networks to check the network connection.

4.1.2 Managing Data Service

To turn on Data Service

- 1. Swipe up from the bottom of the home screen, tap **Settings**.
- 2. Tap Network & Internet and tap Mobile network.
- 3. Tap the switch to turn on Mobile data.






To Turn on Data saver

User can reduce data usage by using Data saver feature to prevent some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

On the setting screen, tap **Network & Internet** \rightarrow **Data Saver** .



Note:

- To select apps to use data without restriction, tap **Unrestricted data** and select apps.
- When Data Saver is on, User can check and mange data saver status on the status bar.





To Turn on Mobile data only apps

Select apps to always use the mobile data even when your device is connected to a Wi-Fi network.

On the Setting screen, tap **Network & Internet** → **Mobile data only apps**.






4.2 WLAN Networks Connection


User can use Wi-Fi feature to connect to a Wi-Fi network and access the Internet or other network devices.

To Turn on WLAN Network Connection

- 2. Tap Network & Internet and tap the switch to enable the WLAN.




- 4. Tap a network to connect it.

5. To check the details about the speed, security, IP address and related settings, tap its name in the WLAN settings screen.


To add a Wi-Fi Network

- 4. Tap Save.




4.3 BT Devices Connection


When BT feature is turned on, the tablet can communicate with other nearby Bluetooth devices.

4.3.1 Turn on BT Connection


- 1. Swipe up from the bottom of the main screen, tap **Settings**.

3. Tap **Bluetooth** and toggle the on/off switch to turn on the BT.






To Connect the BT Device

- 3. Tap **Pair new device**. The system will automatically scan and display the IDs of all available BT device in range.






To Disconnect the BT Device

4.5 Using NFC Tags



NFC Reader support protocol: Type A, Type B, ISO/IEC 15693.

NFC mode is enable default. To deactivate or re-activate NFC, follow these instructions:

- 1. Swipe up from the bottom of the home screen and tap **Setting**.
- 2. Tap \rightarrow Connected devices \rightarrow Connection preferences \rightarrow NFC.

Section 5 Troubleshoot

Computer issues can stem from hardware, software, or a combination of both. Whenever you encounter a problem, it is likely a common issue that can be easily resolved. In this section, we will guide you on the necessary steps to take when troubleshooting typical computer problems.

To assist you further, here are some helpful tips to follow when faced with any problem:

- Firstly, attempt to identify the specific component of the Tablet PC that may be causing the problem.
- Prior to turning on the Tablet PC, ensure that all peripheral devices are properly powered on.
- If there is an issue with an external device, verify that the cable connections are secure and correctly aligned.
- Confirm that all device drivers are accurately installed.
- Take note of any observations you make. Are there any error messages displayed on the screen? Do any indicators light up? Are there any audible beeps? Providing detailed descriptions will be beneficial when seeking assistance from service personnel.

If any problem persists after you follow the instructions in this section, contact an authorized dealer for help.

Nothing appears on the screen.

- The tablet may be in sleep mode. Press the power button to wake up the display.
- The brightness level may be too low. Increase the brightness.

The screen suddenly turns blank and the power indicator goes off.

- Make sure the AC adapter is properly plugged in.
- If running on battery power, the battery may be drained, charge the battery.

Wireless LAN signal quality is poor.

- The tablet may be out of range. Move the tablet closer to the access point or another wireless LAN device associated with it.
- Verify if there are any interferences in your immediate vicinity, like microwave ovens or cordless phones. Relocate the tablet computer away from objects that may cause interference.

I cannot connect to another wireless LAN device.

- Make sure that wireless LAN feature is powered on.
- Make sure that the SSID setting is the same for every wireless LAN device in the network.

- Your Tablet PC is not recognizing changes. Restart the tablet computer.
- Make sure the IP address or subnet mask setting is correct.

I cannot connect to another device with Bluetooth.

- Make sure that both devices have Bluetooth powered on (For the Tablet, check windows setting to see if Bluetooth is powered on).
- Make sure that the distance between the two devices is within 10 meters and there are no walls or large obstructions between the devices.
- Make sure the both devices are powered on and configured to be discoverable.
- Make sure that both devices are compatible.

The GPS application cannot find my location.

- Make sure that GPS is turned on.
- Make sure that GPS receiver and the location sensor are enabled in Setting.
- The tablet computer may be out of coverage area. Move your tablet computer outdoors or closer to a window.
- Check if your surroundings have interferences, such as microwave ovens, cordless phones. Move the tablet computer away from objects causing interference.

No sound is produced.

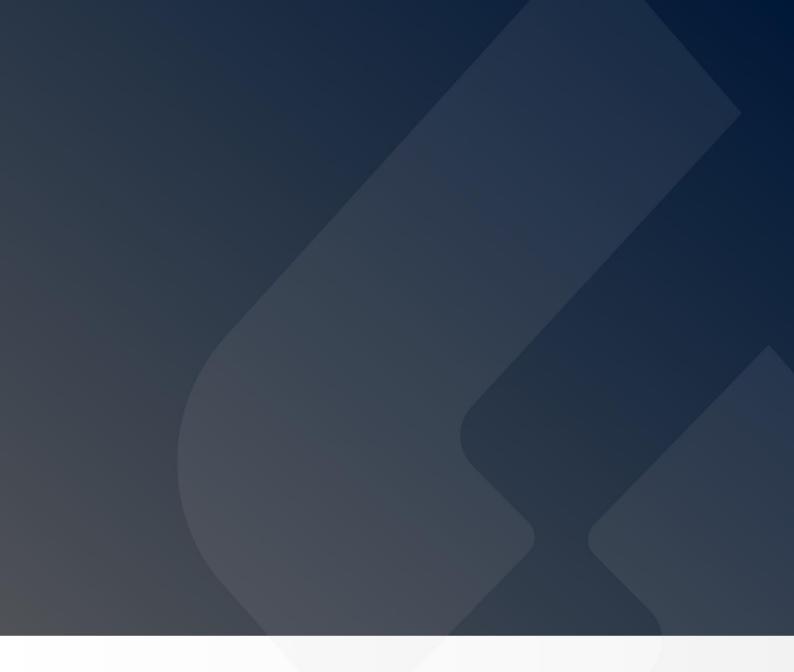
- Adjust volume of the tablet computer by pressing on the volume rocker.
- If using an external audio device, make sure that the cable is properly connected.

I cannot project the tablet computer display to another monitor.

- Make sure the VGA driver is installed.
- Make sure the output setting selected is correct.

Battery leaking or swollen.

- The lithium battery used in this tablet may swell after being charged/ discharged many times, but there is no problem regarding safety.
- Continued use in such a state may result in the battery getting jammed, so please stop using the battery, and purchase a new one.



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
